

CITIZEN'S SUMMARY OF THE ANNUAL IMPLEMENTATION REPORT 2018



The Interreg V-A Latvia – Lithuania Programme 2014 – 2020 (hereinafter – Programme) was approved by the European Commission on 30 November, 2015. The total budget of the Programme is 69,62 m EUR, of which 66,32 m EUR ERDF for funding cooperation projects between Latvian and Lithuanian organisations.



The Programme area includes Kurzeme, Zemgale and Latgale in Latvia and Klaipėda, Telšiai, Šiauliai, Panevėžys, Utena, Kaunas in Lithuania.





In 2018 84 projects were under

implementation, 3 projects already finished their activities but 3 projects still were in contracting phase.

<u>347 project par</u>tners are

implementing projects: LV partners – 185 LT partners – 151. 11 partners from 3 projects (6 LV partners and 5 LT partners) waited for their projects to commence.

In December 2018 European Commission approved Programme amendments and thus together with ERDF co-financing left after previous two Calls for Proposals, 19,2 m EUR of ERDF financing became available for the 3rd Call for Proposals, which announcement is expected in spring 2019.



The Programme was promoted in number of events. Many projects and their contribution to the sustainable development of cross-border region of Latvia and Lithuania was highlighted during Balts' Unity Day celebration on 22 September in Jelgava. About 600 people visited informative tent of the Programme at Hercogs Jēkabs square. There they could watch premiere of Programme's video and see Programme's travelling photo exhibition, and take part in the quiz prepared by the Programme to visit 12 Programme's objects in Jelgava. 15 of participants visited all 12 objects and won prizes.

In order to promote diverse projects of Programme, mobile application "LAT LIT VIETA" was elaborated containing more than 160 objects from Programme`s projects being implemented across all four Programme's priorities in both countries. Programme has handpicked only part of its sites that are accessible to general public and interesting to visit in the meantime trying to give a glimpse of the wealth of Programme's objects. The objective of the project - to improve living conditions in Biržai and Nereta municipalities by promoting employment of social groups.

During project skate park in Birzai was constructed and sport hall in Nereta secondary school was renovated.

Both places are actively used by young people and students. Renovated sport hall provides space for community meetings and events. In spring 2018 two Birzai and Nereta communities friendship sport events were organized with more than 100 participants. Trainings for community members (4 seminars and 1 practical training) were organized in Birzai and Nereta in summer 2018 with 100 participants in each. Training events forged closer links between the communities, motivated and encouraged social inovolvement.

The main objective of the project was to tackle social exclusion problems in Ilūkste (Latvia) and Kretinga (Lithuania) and to create spaces (Family Valley) freely available for local communities.

In Kretinga children playground with outdoor cinema system was created and used by 300 households.In Ilūkste ice skating rink was established and 44 ice skates were bought. 400 people from Ilūkste region participated in project activities.

A lot of attention was paid for socially excluded families. Project organized various meetings and workshops, camps in Latvia and Lithuania where families could socialize with each other.

During 6 workshops families had the opportunity to try new methods in communication, parenting, as well as cooking together with the whole family and making handicrafts. These activities brought family members together.

9 meetings with psychologists allowed families in Kretinga to gain knowledge from specialists and consult with them. Meetings with psychologists brought together families by revealing that most of them has similar challenges and sharing best experiences in solving them.
